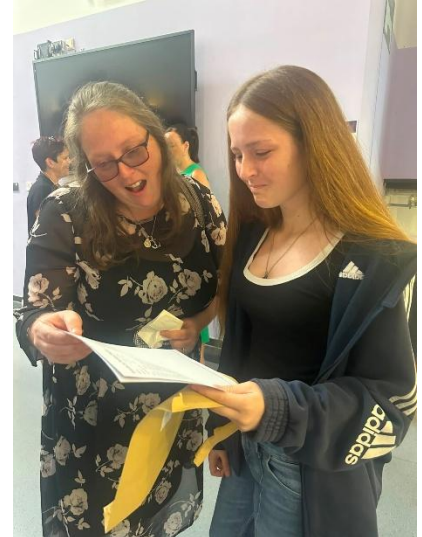


All Saints Academy Plymouth Students Celebrate GCSE Success



Celebrations are taking place at All Saints Academy Plymouth (ASAP) today, Thursday 20th August, as students receive their GCSE results and prepare for their next chapter.

Students collecting their results have secured a variety of exciting next steps, from local apprenticeships at Babcock to continuing their studies at one of the city's fantastic sixth forms.

At ASAP, part of the Ted Wragg Trust, the science curriculum is designed to inspire curiosity, critical thinking and a lifelong love of learning. The academy places a strong emphasis on encouraging more girls to explore STEM subjects, helping to challenge stereotypes and showcase the wide range of opportunities available within the sector.

That commitment is reflected in this year's results, with 100% of female engineering students achieving a grade 7 or above, while every female student taking statistics secured a grade 5 (strong pass) or higher.

There are so many student achievements to celebrate. Skye S secured a collection of grade 7s, including in statistics and is going onto an apprenticeship at Babcock Engineering. She said: *"This school has given me every opportunity to succeed, from the revision support and love I get every day, I am so happy and couldn't of done it without them"*

Finley R is heading to Oaklands Academy with a basketball scholarship after achieving a fantastic set of grades including 6s and 7s.

Kayleigh P celebrated a collection of 8s and 9s and will now be attending College to take Applied Science. She said: *"I am really happy with my results and particularly proud of achieving a Grade 9 in English. Throughout my time at All Saints, all of my teachers have*

been incredibly supportive and were always there when I needed help. I've really enjoyed my time at school and would like to say a huge thank you to all of the teachers for everything they have done to help me succeed. I'm now looking forward to the next chapter as I move on to study Applied Science and continue working towards my future goals."

During their time at All Saints Academy Plymouth, students have been supported to prepare for life beyond year 11 through a range of experiences designed to broaden aspirations and inform future choices. This included visits to sixth forms across Plymouth, where students explored different courses and pathways available to them after GCSEs.

Students have also taken part in a wide range of experiences linked to the world of work, including visits to organisations such as Williams Racing and Princess Yachts, as well as a community project with the Plymouth Fishing and Seafood Association, where students gained hands-on experience of the food industry. They have also developed their teamwork, leadership and technical skills through the school's successful GreenPower engineering and racing team.

Part of the Ted Wragg Trust, these opportunities form part of All Saints Academy Plymouth's commitment to supporting students to make informed choices about their futures through a combination of classroom learning, careers experiences and practical opportunities.
